## Admission to B.A./B.Sc. (Honours \& General) Courses, 2022

## Important Dates:

* Process of admission to B.A./B.Sc. (Honours \& General) Courses, 2022 will start on and from 18.07.2022. For admission details and filling up forms visit the URL www.apccollege.ac.in and open the link "Apply Online" of "UG Admission 2022" tab. Please check the college website for regular updates also.
* The applications are to be submitted through online and no printed form will be available from the college.
* Online Application Forms for admission will be available from 18.07.2022 to 05.08.2022 upto 12 Midnight.
* No charges shall be taken from the students for application and prospectus.
* The college also runs BBA (Honours) which is a self-financing course. Interested candidates are requested to contact through ug.admission@apccollege.ac.in. This course being self financing, the college will not be in a position to run the course if the number of applicant is less than 50 and hence, no merit list for admission will be published for admission to this course. In that case the concerned candidates applied for would be intimated accordingly enabling him/her to fill-up the forms through admission portal.


## Application Procedure

Please read the following instructions carefully before starting the application process.
a) Go to College website www.apccollege.ac.in and click on the "Apply Online" button on UG Admission 2022 tab.
b) Applicants must have an active mobile number and an active email ID for online application. These should be preferably their own as all future communication from the College will be on this number/ email id.

1. Application Procedure:

Step 1: During application, applicants need to submit various kinds of information such as:

- Personal Details
- Guardian Details
- Qualifying Examination Details
- Courses Applied Details
- Contact Details

Once all inputs are saved, an application number with given password will be generated.
Step 2: Upload Testimonials/ Document(s): The applicant is required to upload scanned copies of his/her Photo, Signature and self attested (with date) photocopies of following documents in .jpg format only---

1) Mark Sheet of the Qualifying Examination (Higher Secondary [10+2] or other equivalent examination)
2) Age Proof Document (Birth Certificate or Admit Card showing date of birth)
3) Caste Certificate (for reserved category)
4) PWD Certificate from the appropriate authority (for physically challenged candidates)

Maximum size for uploading the following documents:

- Photograph \& Signature within 20kb to 50kb each.
- Self-attested photocopies of Class 12 Mark Sheet \& Age Proof Certificate within 100kb to 150 kb each.
- All other self attested documents within 50 kb to 100 kb each.

Step 3: Application Fee Payment: There is no Application Fee for this session.
Step 4: Print / Download: The applicant is advised to print / download the following for future reference:

- Application Form
- Online Application Fee Payment Confirmation Receipt

2. Payment: All the payments related to admission for the session have to be made in online mode i.e., through Credit card/ Debit card/ Netbanking. Payment through Wallet is not enabled. After payment of application fees, the application process is final and complete. Please ensure that no mistakes are made during the process of filling up of the application form.
3. Applicant can apply more than one Honours and / or General courses. Each subject combination will be treated as a separate application.
An applicant may submit Application Forms for more than one (01) Honours course and/or General course preference wise. Choose one combination of Generic Subjects from the list, first one for $1^{\text {st }} \& 2^{\text {nd }}$ Semester and second for $3^{\text {rd }} \& 4^{\text {th }}$ Semester corresponding to the Honours subject applied for.
4. After the last date of submission of online application, a Provisional List (According to Merit) will be published on the college website. Please note that this list is published for the applicant to check the lists of respective categories (Gen/SC/ST/OBC/PWD) for respective
streams and subjects and ensure that his/her application has been accepted and no inadvertent error has occurred in this respect.
If any unintentional error like non inclusion of name or any other discrepancy is noted by the applicant or if the applicant has any academic enquiry regarding the above list, he/she may send a mail to that effect to ug.admission@apccollege.ac.in. The window for complaint/enquiry would remain open from the time of the publication of the Provisional List till 11:59 pm the next day. Any query/complaint received after this time will not be entertained. 5. The college will require at least one day to solve the possible issues raised by applicants. Following this a Final Merit List will be published on the college website. The college will not entertain any further complaint/query after the publication of this list.
5. The Admission process will then start with publication of Merit List for Admission. The Merit Lists will be published on the college website in regular phases, according to availability of seats in each stream and subject. All concerned applicants are requested to check the college website REGULARLY (on a DAILY basis) for such information.
6. The applicants selected in the Merit List for Admission in all the phases of admission published on the college website will be informed through SMS and e-mail. However, for their own convenience all applicants must check the college website on the given date to see the Merit Lists for Admission in order to negate any room for error.
An applicant listed in the particular merit list MUST take admission in each phase of admission during in the stipulated time paying the Admission Fees online through the link given in the admission portal to complete the process. Failure to complete the admission through payment of admission fees by any selected applicant within the stipulated time will mean that the applicant will permanently lose his/her opportunity of getting admitted to the college.
7. Vacant seats on reserved categories (if any) will be filled up after de-reservation from competent authority. However, any vacancy seat of ST category can be filled up by candidate of SC category.
8. Students coming from the vocational stream can be considered for admission to B.A./B.Sc. (General) courses only.
9. Please note that all admissions done through the online system are provisional subject to physical verification of original documents by the College and approval of the University. All applicants are requested to be very careful while submitting relevant information and uploading of testimonials during the online process of application/admission. Verification of documents will be done only when the students report for the classes. Dates for verification will be notified later on college website. All the original documents should be produced at the time of verification. Admission will be cancelled if the documents are found not in conformity with the declaration in the form submitted online.
10. In case the applicant is already admitted to any other college/institute during the time of admission to this college, it would be his/her responsibility to cancel that admission at the earliest otherwise he/she will face serious problems at the time of University registration.
11. In case the applicant wishes to cancel his/her admission in this college and get refund the admission fee, he/she is required to fill up the cancellation form, details of bank and submit it online. Once the cancellation is approved by the college authority the applicant can take a print out of the cancellation receipt. During the process of cancellation to be complete an OTP will be generated and sent to the registered mobile number of the applicant ONLY.

## Criteria for Admission to Honours \& General Course

The admission sub-committee formulates rules for admission following the guidelines of the University.

## Regulations in respect of admission to degree courses (Honours, General)

## Admission Qualifications

A candidate who has passed the Higher Secondary $(10+2)$ or its equivalent examination is eligible to seek admission to the First Semester of the Six Semester B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. (Hons and Genl) or B.A. Music. (Hons. and Genl.) Course of studies provided he/she has also passed in English having full marks not being less than 100 .

In any case, where there is an ambiguity regarding the admissibility of a particular examination at the Higher Secondary ( $10+2$ ) level of study, the matter shall be referred to the Equivalence Committee of the University who shall determine the eligibility of the said examination.

However, no candidate, in general, shall be allowed for admission in the course after a lapse of more than 3 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination. Those desirous to do so will seek permission from the University Authority. The year of admission shall not be taken into account while calculating 3 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.
However, in exceptional cases a candidate may be allowed for admission after 3 years of the previous qualifying examination but within 3 years after discontinuation of a recognized regular Course of Study. Those desirous to do so will seek permission from the University Authority. This exception is valid for both Honours and General courses of study.

For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission to the Honours Course, aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks of top four subjects in order of marks secured by a candidate. However, marks in compulsory Environmental Education/Studies shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks. If the subject "Environmental Science" is studied as an elective subject of 100 marks, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks.

## Eligibility Condition

(a) A candidate taking up Honours Course in a subject must have obtained:
i) A minimum of $50 \%$ marks in the aggregate and $45 \%$ marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination. In case of B. Mus. (Hons.) $45 \%$ marks in the aggregate and $45 \%$ marks in the subject Music in the pre-qualifying examination.

OR
ii) $55 \%$ marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.

OR
iii) $50 \%$ marks in the aggregate when the candidate has not studied the subject in his/her previous qualifying examination provided all the other clauses are satisfied.
However, if in any Honours subject, the number of applications are so low that even the permitted intake of the college cannot be filled up, then the Principal may use his discretionary power to reduce the minimum requirement for admission in that subject.

A written note in that respect should reach the Registrar for consideration of that decision for a final approval by the University and the decision will be communicated to the Dept. of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal for information.
(b) However, candidates belonging to the Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe Community taking up Honours Course of study must have obtained a minimum of $40 \%$ marks in the aggregate and $40 \%$ marks in the subject or related subjects at the previous qualifying examination, as the case may be.

## Candidates from other Boards:

(a) Students, who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) examination or its equivalent from the All India Boards/Councils or State Boards/Councils including Open Schools and vocational studies, are eligible for study at the UG level.
(b) Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) examination or its equivalent from the All India Boards/Councils (i.e. CBSE, ISC and National Institute of Open Schooling) are not required to submit the Migration Certificate for getting Registration under this University.
(c) Any dispute regarding eligibility criteria would be resolved by the Equivalence Committee set up by the University or by the Executive Council in its absence.

## Choice of Courses

(a). For the B.A./B.Sc. (Honours) Course of Studies, a candidate is required to choose his/her Honours in a discipline and two other disciplines for Generic Elective courses, from among Group-I to GroupVIII as follows by taking not more than one discipline from any of the groups mentioned hereunder:
(b). For the B.Sc. (General) Course of Studies, a candidate is required to choose three disciplines from among Group-I to Group-VIII as follows by taking not more than one discipline from any of the groups mentioned hereunder:
(c). For the B.A. (General) Course of Studies, a candidate is required to choose two main disciplines and for Generic Elective courses the student is required to choose a third discipline, from among GroupI to Group-VIII as follows by taking not more than one discipline from any of the groups mentioned hereunder:

Gr. V : Political Science, Electronics, Industrial Fish \& Fisheries

Gr. VII : Statistics, Physiology, English
Gr. VIII : Anthropology, Computer Science, Bengali, Hindi, Urdu, Computer Application
5. Mandatory Subject Requirement (at H. S. level) A candidate shall be allowed to take up the discipline (s) under heading "A" if he/she had passed the subject (s) under heading "B" at the previous qualifying examination.

6. Some Special conditions for admission to Honours \& General Courses as follows: To take up Honours in any subject, the candidate has to pass in that "subject" or "any related subject" in the H.S. examination. In the above table, in general, "subject" and "related subject" are given under the columns A and B. However, the following restrictions supersede the previous clause.
i) For B. Com. (Honours) Course, the word "subject" or "related subject" shall mean exactly the same list as given in Serial No. 13 under Column B above.
ii) Economics: A candidate shall be allowed to take up Honours in Economics if he/she has passed in Mathematics with atleast $45 \%$ marks at the H.S. or its equivalent Examination. However, it is advisable that a student pursuing Honours in Economics takes Mathematics as a Generic Elective (for pursuing higher studies in the subject in future). A student shall be given B.Sc Honours degree in Economics if he/she takes up at least one discipline from the Science group for his/her Generic Elective (as given in sec 7b) and shall be awarded B.A Honours degree in Economics if both the disciplines chosen for Generic Electives are from the Arts \& Humanities group (as given in sec 7a). A student will be given B.Sc degree in Economics if he/she earns required number of credits in the structure appropriate for B.Sc General and chooses at least one discipline from science group besides economics.

A student will be given B.A. degree in Economics if he/she earns required number of credits in the structure appropriate for B.A. General and chooses the other main discipline (and not the Generic Elective) from Arts \& Humanities group besides economics.
(iii) Mathematics: a candidate, who has passed Mathematics (and not Business Mathematics) at H.S. level, is eligible for admission to Mathematics Honours course. A student will only be given the B.Sc degree for Mathematics subject. It is mandatory for the student to choose both the subjects from the Science group (as given in sec 7b) to be eligible for the aforesaid degree.
(iv) Bio-Chemistry: Students studying Honours in Biochemistry will have to take elective subjects as stand hereunder and in conformity with Grouping of subjects: (a) Any one of the subjects: Physics/Mathematics/Statistics \& (b) Any one of the subjects: Zoology/Botany/ Microbiology/ Physiology /Molecular Biology
v) Microbiology: Students studying Honours in Microbiology will have to take elective subjects from the following list: Chemistry and Mathematics/ Physics / Botany/Zoology/Physiology
vi) Anthropology: Students pursuing Honours in Anthropology should take Generic Elective disciplines from the Science Group (as given in sec 7b).
vii) Education/Sociology: Subjects Psychology, Philosophy, Mathematics, Sociology, Education, Economics, Political Science, History be treated as related subject.
viii) Philosophy: Subject Psychology is a related subject.
ix) Food and Nutrition: A candidate shall be allowed to take up Honours in Food and Nutrition if he/she has passed in Chemistry at the H.S. Examination and has to take up Chemistry as one of the elective subject. However, the students for General Course, studying Chemistry at the H.S level is not mandatory A student will only be given the B.Sc degree for Food and Nutrition subject. It is mandatory for the student to choose both the subjects from the Science group (as given in sec 7b) to be eligible for the aforesaid degree.
x) Physics: Students studying Honours in Physics will have to take elective subjects as stand hereunder and in conformity with Grouping of subjects: (a) One of the subjects: Mathematics and (b) Any one of the subjects: Chemistry, Electronics, Statistics, Computer science
xi) Electronics: Students studying Honours in Electronics will have to take elective subjects as stand hereunder and in conformity with Grouping of subjects: One of the subjects: Mathematics. The other subject has to be chosen from: Physics and Computer Science. However, it is advisable that a student pursuing Honours in Electronics takes Mathematics and Physics as Generic Elective (for pursuing higher studies in the subject in future).
xii) Geography: A student will only be given the B.A/B.Sc Honours degree for Geography subject. Students studying Geography will have to take two disciplines as generic elective subjects from the disciplines mentioned hereunder and in conformity with Grouping of subjects: Mathematics, Statistics, Computer Science, Economics, Political Science, Zoology, Anthropology, Education, History A student who wants to study B.A/B.Sc General with Geography as one of the Core subject will have to take the other two subjects from the disciplines mentioned hereunder and in conformity with Grouping of subjects: Mathematics, Statistics, Computer Science, Economics, Political Science, Zoology, Anthropology, Education, History
xiii) Computer Science: Students studying Honours in Computer Science will have to take Generic Elective subjects as stand hereunder and in conformity with Grouping of subjects: Two disciplines from the following list : Physics, Mathematics, Statistics, Electronics.

## Divisions of Honours and General subjects of B.A./B.Sc. courses under different disciplines:

a) Arts \& Humanities: History, English, Bengali, Hindi, Urdu, Political Science, Sanskrit, Pali, Philosophy, Sociology, Education, Arabic, Journalism \& Mass Communication, Music, Physical Education, Human Rights, Film Studies, Travel \& Tourism Management, Advertising and Sales Promotion, Women Studies
b) Science: Physics, Zoology, Chemistry, Botany, Psychology, Mathematics, Molecular Biology, Statistics, Microbiology, Anthropology, Geography, Physiology, Economics, Defence Studies, Computer Science, Electronics, Biochemistry, Physical Education, Environmental Science, Food and Nutrition, Agriculture \& Rural Development, Human Development, Industrial Fish and Fisheries
c) Home Science: Human Development, Social Science

## Students seeking admission to the 1st year degree classes should take note of the following :

i) The last date for the submission of the admission forms should be rigidly maintained.
ii) Merit list will be published on time and this will be followed by counselling by different departments. Time and day will be duly notified. The dates of counselling should be strictly maintained. The students who have decided their choice of subject after counselling must take their admission on the very day of counselling. If any deserving candidate's name is inadvertently left out from the list, he or she should immediately contact the Principal for rectification before the counselling.
iii) In respect of admission the college authority reserves the right to make final decision without being answerable to any outside person, agency etc.
iv) On the date of admission all the ORIGINAL documents should be produced.
v) All admissions are provisional.

The admission of the S.C./S.T./O.B.C-A / O.B.C-B /Physically Challenged candidates is regulated by Government norms. Special consideration in admission may be made to those students having
outstanding performance in games and sports. These candidates should furnish attested copies of S.C. / S.T. / O.B.C. certificate, issued by appropriate authority as per the latest Government Order. Physically Challenged Candidates must attach attested copies of relevant documents from the competent authority. The Principal has the authority to reject any application for admission, without showing reasons, in the interest of the college.

## Subject Combinations offered under Choice Based by the College

1. A candidate willing to take any B.A. / B.Sc. Honours subject has two choices of Generic electives for opting any one of the code against any Honours subject.
2. Candidates from B.A. / B.Sc. Honours course will study Generic Elective I in Semester I \& II and Generic Elective II in Semester III \& IV.
3. A candidate will be offered any one subject combination in B.A. / B.Sc. General Course under Science or Arts stream.
