The College

Situated in a quiet corner of Chinsurah, the headquarters of Burdwan Division and Hooghly District, **Hooghly Mohsin College** is one of the premier academic institutions of India, promoting the cause of higher education for one hundred and eighty six long years. Following a blueprint prepared by **Macaulay** and with the help of a trust fund of the legendary philanthropist **Haji Mohammed Mohsin**, the college started its journey on the 1st day of August, 1836 in **Perron's** house, a magnificent piece of architecture overlooking the river, Hooghly.

For the first one hundred years of its existence, the college was known as **New Hooghly College**. On the occasion of its centenary celebrations, the college was renamed as **Hooghly Mohsin College**.

This glorious House of Learning nurtured some of the doyens of the nineteenth century Indian Renaissance. Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay, the composer of 'Bande Mataram' and other eminent writers of Bengal like Dwijendralal Roy, Sanjib Chandra Chattopadhyay, Rangalal Bandyopadhyay were distinguished students of this college. Biplabacharya Jyotis Chandra Ghosh, Mujaffar Ahmed, Kanailal Datta, Bhupati Majumder, Charu Chandra Roy, Pramathanath Mitra, Brahmabandhab Upadhyay, Debendranath Mondal who were associated with this college as students or teachers, dedicated their lives to the cause of Indian Freedom Movement. A versatile genius, Judge and Jurist, wise leader, writer and historian, Syed Amir Ali was an eminent alumnus of this college of national heritage. Famous scientists such as Dr. Upendranath Brahmachari, Sahairam Basu and J.N. Bhar significantly contributed to Science and Medicine in the global perspective. Noted singers of India like Shyamal Mitra and Satinath Mukhopadhyay who contributed immensely in the cultural world, were students of this college. Since its historic inception as the First Seat of English Education in India in 1836 to the present, this college has been nurturing talents who have always done our country proud. The Main building, the Science Blocks and the cheerful college garden lend quite a unique touch to the ambience of the college campus. Besides the Under Graduate and Post Graduate Departments, the college has a separate Law Section. The college provides its students an excellent setting

where they can recognize and utilize their full potential to pursue higher education, become professionals and eventually play their own roles in the enrichment of the intellectual resources of the country to drive and shape her future. By fostering a family environment where educational, social, and emotional needs are addressed through a holistic approach, the college constantly strives to mould its students into successful and responsible citizens.

The college was affiliated to University of Calcutta since 1857. The college was later affiliated to University of Burdwan since its inception in 1960. Since then the college is a constituent college of the University of Burdwan. On 1st August 2021, the college observed its 186th Anniversary celebrations with due homage to the Founder and noted Alumni who made the college a significant place of higher education in India. The Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Burdwan University, Prof. Nimai Chandra Saha; the Hon'ble former Vice Chancellor, West Bengal State University, Prof. Basab Chaudhuri; the Principal, Hooghly Mohsin College, Prof. Purushottam Pramanik; distinguished members of the Alumni Association of Hooghly Mohsin College; faculty members; non-teaching staff members and students of the college joined this programme.

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Muhammad Mohsin's Biography

Haji Muhammad Mohsin was a prominent philanthropist in Bengal. Mohsin was born to Haji Faizullah and Zainab Khanam in Hooghly in 1732. He was self-taught and vastly learned in the Quran, Hadith and the Fiqh. He travelled to different countries - Iran, Iraq, Arabia and made pilgrimage to holy places, for he believed that travelling widens the horizon of one's perception. He led a very simple and pious life. In the Government record of 1769-70 he is mentioned as setting up several langarkhanas during the Famine of that period and donating to the Government famine fund. He dedicated all the income from his property for charity and, social and educational causes. It is believed that one- third of his fortune was donated for education and religious programmes, four- ninth was donated for giving pensions to the elderly and disabled and the rest was for the expenses of the two trustees. Because of his generosity he was called Danvir Mohsin.

He was the founder of Hooghly Immambara. He also gave 40 acres of land out of 42 acres for establishing Government BL College, Khulna, Bangladesh. To commemorate his immense contribution in the field of education, many educational institutions in India and Bangladesh have been named after Muhammad Mohsin. Hooghly Mohsin College, formerly known as New Hooghly College in Chinsurah, West Bengal, was established by him. The College was renamed as Hooghly Mohsin College on its centenary day celebration in 1936 to acknowledge the contribution of its founder Haji Muhammad Mohsin to spread education in West Bengal. On 29th November, 1812, he breathed his last.

Each course is divided into four semesters. At the end of each semester the University conducts an examination.

For all courses, Academic Session is July to June.

<u>SEMESTER WISE COURSE STRUCTURES OF B.A./B.Sc. / B.Com. UNDER THE</u> <u>CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)</u>

Under the CBCS there are broadly **two** course structures- i) **Honours** Course and ii) **Regular/General** Course. The main components of the courses are as follows:

1. <u>Core Course</u> : A course, that should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement, is termed as a core course.

2. <u>Elective Course</u> : Generally a course, which can chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/ subject/ domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/ skill, is called an Elective Course.

2.1 <u>Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course</u> : A course, which may be offered by the main discipline/ subject of study, is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.

2.2 <u>Generic Elective (GE) Course</u> : An elective course, chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/ subject of study with an intention to seek an exposure, is called a Generic Course.

<u>N.B.</u>- A Core Course, offered in a discipline/ subject, may be treated as an elective by other discipline/ subject and vice- versa and such electives may also be referred to as **Generic Elective**.

2.3 <u>Dissertation/ Project</u> : An elective course, designed to acquire special/ advanced knowledge, is termed as dissertation/ project. This is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in solving/ analyzing / exploring a real life situation/ difficult problem. A dissertation/ project work will be of 6 credits. A dissertation/ project work may be given in lieu of a Discipline Specific Elective.

3. <u>Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)</u> : The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds- Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC).

3.1 AECC : These are the courses based on the contents that lead to knowledge enhancement and consist of Environmental Studies & English/ MIL Communication. These are mandatory for all disciplines.

3.2 SEC : SEC are value- based and/ or skill- based and are aimed at providing hand-ontraining, competency, skill etc. It will be minimum 2 for Honours Courses and 4 for General Courses. These may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value- based and/ or skill- based knowledge would contain both theory and lab./ hands-on-training/ field work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide the students life-skill in hands-on-mode so as to increase their employability.

Practical/ Tutorial : One each with every Core, Discipline Specific and Generic Elective Paper.

An Under-graduate General Degree in Science may be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in three disciplines of choice, 2 papers each from a list of DSEs based on the three disciplines of choice selected above, 2 papers in AECC and minimum 4 papers in SEC.

An Under-graduate General Degree in Humanities/ Social Sciences/ Commerce may be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in two disciplines of choice along with 2 core papers each in two Languages from English, Bengali and Hindi respectively, 2 papers each from a list of DSEs based on the two disciplines of choice selected above and 2 papers from the list of GEs, 2 papers in AECC and minimum 4 papers in SEC.

* Wherever there is a practical, there will be no tutorial and vice- versa.

The evaluation of the candidates shall be based on continuous assessment. The structure of evaluation shall be as follows:

- i) Each semester- assessment shall be divided into three (3) discrete components, viz. C_1 , C_2 and C_3 . The students will be informed about the modalities of continuous assessment activities well in advance. The first component (C_1) of assessment shall be of **10%** of the total marks of each course of a semester and will be based on class attendance, class test or assignment or seminar. During the first two months of each semester, 1/3 of the syllabus will be completed. The continuous assessment and C_1 will be consolidated during the 8th week of the concerned semester. The second component (C_2) of assessment shall be of **10%** of the total marks of each course of a semester and will be based on class attendance, class test or assignment or seminar. During the second two months of each semester, 2/3 of the syllabus will be completed. The continuous assessment and C_2 will be consolidated during the 16th week of the concerned semester. Appearance in C_1 & C_2 is mandatory.
- ii) During the 21st 23rd weeks of a semester, a Semester- end Examination shall be conducted for each course and the proportion of $C_{3 \text{ will}}$ be **80%** of the total marks each course of the semester.

iii) The result of each course in a semester shall be based on the values of C_1 , C_2 & C_3 and shall be awarded in form of grade point.

iii) 1 Credit = 1 Practical class of 2- hour duration

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Hooghly Mohsin College

Central Library

Hooghly Mohsin College Library, previously Hooghly College library, was established in the year 1836 with some donated books. That time there was no record of library in this district. Principal James Alexander Wise took initiative to start a library not only for its own students but for its neighbours also. College library was started with the grant from the Govt. and with donated books. Mr. Han was the first Librarian. Library grant started with Rs- 400, now it stands near about 20 lakhs per year. In the year number of books as on record 9275 which now increases 1,13,000 books from govt. Grant, 3,500 books from UGC grant ,10,000 books of rare types. There are donated books. Total collection includes approximately 2,000,00 books. There are some books which may not be found anywhere in India, may be in the British Library, London.

This library has two parts. One in the main building and one in the Dwijendralal Bhavan. Books are categorised with 18 subjects which are taught in the college.

Our students and teachers are getting facilities with INFLIBNET services by which world class Journals are available.

Seminar Library

In addition to the Central Library, each department maintains a seminar library, which caters to Honours students. Post Graduate students are also entitled to this facility from the respective departments.

Laboratories

The College has well equipped laboratories with all the science departments. Department of Zoology has a museum.

Computer

Computer facility is available in almost all the science departments as well as in the library. Separate computer labs are present at the departments of Commerce, Mathematics, and Geology. Broadband internet facility is available in all the science departments and this facility is provided to the teachers and the students by the Central Library Computers.

Common Rooms

There are separate Common Rooms for the girls and boys students, both equipped with various indoor games facilities.

Health

Treatment facilities are available in the district Govt. Hospital College has kept arrangement of first aid for primary care.

Canteen

One centralized Canteen for students, with a separate canteen building located in the college premises, and a Teachers' Canteen within the Staff Room provide Tiffin, snacks and lunch to the students and staffs at nominal rate.

Students' Hostels

The College has two hostels for boys only, namely, Kanailal Dutta Hostel (accommodation: 53) and Zachariah Hostel (accommodation: 16). Applications for admission into the hostels are to be made in the prescribed forms obtained from the hostel office.

Internal Complaints Committee

The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act,2013 implemented by the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India. The Ministry of Human Resource Development via notification dated 2nd May, 2016 made University Grants Commission (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal of Sexual Harassment of Women employees and students in Higher Educational Institutions) Regulation, 2015. It is a comprehensive legislation to provide a safe, secure and enabling environment, free from sexual harassment to every woman. This statute was enacted to fill the legislative void which had been partially addressed by the judiciary in *Vishaka and Others v. State of Rajasthan and Others* (1997 (7) SCC 323). In this seminal public interest litigation verdict, the Supreme Court of India had framed a set of guidelines ("**Vishaka Guidelines**") for dealing with instances of sexual harassment at the workplace, which has now been codified in the POSH Act.

Under the POSH Act, an employer is legally required to comply with certain statutory requirements. One of these is the constitution of an Internal Complaints Committee ("ICC"), a body envisaged to receive complaints on sexual harassment at the workplace from an aggrieved woman, as well as to inquire into and make recommendations to the employer on the action required pursuant to its inquiry of such complaint made.

UGC Regulation states the responsibility of HEIs to act decisively against all gender based violence against employees and students of all sexes and to reinforce its commitment to creating its campus free from discrimination, harassment, retaliation and any form of sexual assault.

According to Supreme Court Guidelines Sexual Harassment can be defined as unwelcome sexually determined behavior whether directly or by implication as

- 1. Physical contact and advances
- 2. Demand or request for sexual favours
- 3. Making sexually coloured remarks
- 4. Showing pornography
- 5. Any other unwelcome physical, verbal or nonverbal conduct of sexual nature.

Objective and Role of ICC

- 1. To take consistent action for Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal of Complaint received regarding sexual harassment, gender discrimination of women employee at Workplace.
- 2. Prevent gender discrimination and sexual harassment by promoting gender sensitization among the students and employees.
- 3. Make recommendations to the administration to lay down the procedures for the prohibition, resolution and prosecution of acts of discrimination and sexual harassment by the student and the employee.
- 4. Deal with the cases of discrimination and sexual harassment of a women employee in a time bound manner aiming at ensuring support services to the victim and termination of harassment.
- 5. Recommend appropriate punitive action against guilty party.

- 6. Constantly keep a vigil on the internal processes to check on the safety parameters for women workers especially.
- 7. Recommend to the employer on changes that needs to be incorporated in various policies, processes and procedural matters related to safety of employees/prevent any kind of sexual harassment from taking place

What is Ragging?

As per the order of Supreme Court of India and subsequent Notification from University Grants Commission (UGC), ragging means the following :

- 1. Any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or a junior student.
- Indulging in a rowdy or undisciplined activity which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student.
- 3. Asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.
- 4. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of other student or a fresher.
- 5. Exploiting services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or group of students.
- 6. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students.
- 7. Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background

Punishment to those found guilty

Any student or group of students found guilty of ragging in the campus or even outside the campus shall be liable to one or more of the following punishments :

- 1. Cancellation of admission.
- 2. Suspension from attending classes.
- 3. Withholding/withdrawing scholarships/fellowships and other benefits.
- 4. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
- 5. Withholding result.
- 6. Debarring from representing in institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
- 7. Suspension/expulsion from hostel.

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- 8. Rustication from the institution for a period ranging from one to four semesters.
- 9. Expulsion from the institution and couregment debarring from admission to any other institution.
- 10. Fine ranging between Rs. 25,000 and Rs. 1,00,000.
- 11. Collective punishment : when the person committing the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.

ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE

Hooghly Mohsin College has an Anti–Ragging Committee, actively working under the Visakha Guidelines and the Anti-Ragging Act of 2005 as per UGC Guidelines, to prevent any form of ragging within the college campus, be it physical, psychological or even sexual.

• There is an Anti-Ragging Squad as well, keeping constant watch over the campus, in order to ensure the prevention of ragging. Our college maintains 'Zero Tolerance' to any of such incidents, if occur.
