Applicants are required to apply online within the stipulated time period and make the required payment of application fee through <u>online payment</u> <u>only. There is no provision for offline payment through bank counters.</u>

Candidates can apply 24x7 during the period the application is available on the given websites. Candidates are required to download the payment receipt generated during submission of application and preserve the same for future reference.

- Each candidate can apply for a maximum of four subjects. Candidates must take a print-out of the application form and payment receipt generated after successful online submission of the forms and produce the same only at the time of commencement of classes for verification
- The price of each form is Rs. 150/- only.
- Candidates can apply online 24x7 from 27.05.2019 (11 am) to 02.06.2019 (11.59 pm). They are required to pay the application fee through online procedure only during the time of application.
- Online submission of forms for undergraduate admission for the academic session 2019-20 will close after 11.59 PM of 2.6.2019.
- The candidates do NOT have to submit the college copy of payment receipt
  to the college immediately after online submission of the form. They are
  instructed to keep the receipt with themselves and submit it at the college
  only at the time of commencement of classes for verification.
- Candidates are required to upload following documents during the time of application.
  - Photo of candidate
  - Signature of candidate
  - Age Proof (Admit card of Madhyamik or equivalent)
  - Mark sheet of H.S. or equivalent
  - Caste certificate if applicable
  - PwD certificate if applicable
- Candidates will be informed through e-mail and SMS after successful online submission of application. In case of DND settings in applicant's contact number she may not receive any SMS. The college will not remain responsible in such cases.
- Admission is conducted strictly on the basis of merit.
- Provisional Merit List to be published tentatively on 08.06.2019.

- There will be no admission test for admission to any UG course. Merit list of candidates selected for admission will be prepared according to the "Index Marks Formulae" given below.
