

Introduction 💌

1924 Narasinha Dutt College came up in the residential building In of the late I. R. Belilious in an inconspicuous manner with only seven teachers and 124 students. The step was indeed bold enough as its prospects were challenging. The initiative in this regard was taken by Late Suranjan Dutta, the second son of Late Narasinha Dutta. The college started with Late Professor Motilal Chatterjee as Principal and a renowned scholar, Late Jnanendranath Sen, as Vice-Principal. Later on, Prof. Sen, as Principal, came to be reckoned as the architect of the college. With the passage of time, role strength remarkably increased, new honours courses were introduced and new buildings were added. The number of courses (Hons & Gen) now stands at eighteen. At present 77 Substantive full-time teachers and 43 State Aided College Teachers (SACT) teach about five thousand students (Morning, Day and Evening) of the College. 22 Whole-time staff members and 21 Casual staff members are working in our college. Post Graduate courses in Mathematics and English have been introduced. Despite being located in an industrial belt, the college campus is like an oasis with its old trees, lush green foliage, seasonal flowers and a pleasant water body. The pond is maintained by Employees' Co-operative Credit Society of the college. The facilities which attract students from both rural and urban areas of Howrah and neighbouring districts are being upgraded every year.



Our college is one of the few colleges in West Bengal to receive the Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) 2.0 Grant for the Financial Year 2018-20. The following are details of the work under this grant:



Facilities

The Science departments have large well equipped laboratories with modern instruments to cater to the needs of the revised undergraduate curriculum.

The Central Library

The College Library of Narasinha Dutt College has a long history since 1924 when it was initiated in the old college building Room No.-1. At the initial stage, the library had in its stock a small number of books and other documents received from the personal collections of many renowned persons of this area as well as the teachers. Due to increase in the library stock it was necessary to shift the entire library to another big space. That apart, a large number of books were damaged for water logging in the college. So, then it was shifted at the 3rd floor of West Building of the college during the period of 1976-77. The library committee at that time managed to collect a large number of books from various sources. Yet the library faced various problems for its location – very little number of users accessed the library in the top floor of the building, extreme heat gradually damaged the books and extraneous effect was too much for the users, damaged ceiling was also a big problem for that room. Therefore, the Library Committee further decided to shift the library to a more suitable location. During the period of 1998-99 it was finally shifted at its present location i.e. 1st floor of the New Building in this college. Book Bank

The college provides Book Bank facility for more than 35 years. At present, the Bank holds more than 17,000 books on different subjects in Arts, Science and Commerce.



Internet Resource Centre

The Air Conditioned Internet Resource Centre has been established by the UGC sanctioned fund. Now it is located inside the Central Library where the library members can access the internet facilities for their academic purposes. Presently, the Centre has been enriched with 6000+ e-journals and 31,35,000 e-books under N-LIST Programme of INFLIBNET.



Computer Facilities

A computer centre has been set up with assistance from MPLAD fund in a separate building having a large number of computer terminals with internet connection. Besides this, all the teaching departments have their respective desktop and laptop computers with internet connections and Wi-fi system. The Department of Mathematics and the Department of Computer Science have their own computer laboratories. The Department of commerce has a computer based IT Laboratory for students and teachers.

The College office is almost fully automated with most of the services being computerised.

AV Room & Virtual Class Room

An audio-visual room is constructed in the Computer Science Block.

Grievance Redressal Cell

This cell has been formed with a view to dealing with the grievances of the students, teachers, employees and guardians. Written complaints in all matters are to be dropped in boxes specially marked for the grievance redressal cell.

Parents - Teachers Meeting

Parents - Teachers meetings are held by different departments to apprise the parents about the performance and progress of their wards in studies. All parents are advised to keep in touch with the administration and the teachers of the concerned departments.

Free medicines were also distributed.

A poster competition on various types of 'pollutions' took place in the last session. Though the results were declared, prizes could not be distributed due to shortage of time. Henceforth in this session, a prize - giving ceremony was organised on 24th September 2019 and mementos were given to the position - holders.

Not only that, medals were awarded to several student volunteers who performed sincerely for the NSS unit. This was done in order to encourage the students to work more sincerely for the NSS in future.

The Department of Chemistry started its journey with Chemistry as a General subject in the year 1924 in order to extend the study of chemistry to the students from the suburbs of Howrah district and Howrah town under the stewardship of Prof Jnanendranath Sen who was the Vice-Principal of the college at that time. There were no colleges of higher education in Howrah at that time.

Later on in the year 1948 the department introduced the Chemistry Honours course. At that time and years thereafter Narasinha Dutt College emerged as the premier learning institute in chemistry in the district of Howrah. Down the years teaching in the morning and evening sections were also introduced along with the Day section. But a couple of years back the morning and evening sections were discontinued due to lack of teaching staff. Some of the notable teachers in this department were Prof. Himangshu Banerjee, Prof. Himangshu Bhattacharyva and Prof. Dr. Kshetra Prasad Sen Sharma. Prof Bhattacharyya later on joined Presidency College and Prof Sen Sharma was the faculty member of Jadavpur University. The alumnus of this department boasts of some of the big names in academia and other spheres such as Late Prof. Manindra Mohan Chakravorty (formerly of IACS, Jadavpur), Dr. Jyotimay Nandi (Scientist in USA), Dr. Jyotiprakash Chatterjee (Scientist in USA), Prof. Subir Basu Roy, Prof. Dilip Khamui (West Bengal Education Department), Dr Omprakash Chatterjee (Scientist, CGCRI), Dr. Nijhuma Mondal (Scientist, CGCRI), and many more who have established themselves in their respective fields.

The department which initially started with two laboratories added to its tally with two more laboratories for Honours students being set up in the newly constructed J.N. Sen Centenary Block which presently houses the Chemistry department. Another make shift laboratory was built up recently to compensate for the loss of space due to demolition of the old building for new construction purpose. All the laboratories are well equipped according to UG level of study with most of the Modern equipments present.

The performance of the students was traditionally good in this department. The number of students getting high first class marks has increased down the year and presently some of them are regularly

The department of Physics has been an integral part of the college right from its inception in the year 1924. However, at the time, the department offered only a pass course in Physics. The department started offering an honours course from the mid-sixties. The department has nurtured several deserving pupils towards their better future. Many students have ranked high in the University Examination. Majority of the students have opted for higher studies after completing their BSc course. The faculty members and support staff are very welcoming and always care for the students. Currently, the department is operating with seven teaching and two non-teaching staffs.

A total of 32 students appeared for university exams this year and 29 of them passed 94% of which opted for higher studies as M.Sc, B.Tech, Ph.D. which requires qualifying NET, GATE, JAM, IITs, etc. Many of our ex-students are engaged in advanced research activities as Ph. D. scholar at various reputed research institutes of our country. Few have travelled abroad to join research labs. Majority of the ex-students are placed in various govt. and private jobs in Banking, School, UPSC etc.

According to availability, the department organizes some students to deliver a series of lectures, topics selected apart from syllabus, followed by question and answer session, aiming to reduce the fear of facing future interviews and also to get a taste of the academic career. A departmental students' seminar was held on 07.01.2020.

The Department maintains its own Seminar Library where students can issue books if needed. Teachers' Day along with greeting the Fresh faces was celebrated with much joy as usual like each year on 05.09.2019.

The department was established in 1962. At that time it offered only Zoology general courses. From the year 1970 Zoology honours courses were introduced.

From then this department has been maintaining its glorious tradition of making excellent results at the undergraduate examinations under the University of Calcutta. The Zoology department is also glorified by the students involved in various important professions.

The department is like a family where the teachers and students are involved in the teaching and learning process not only in the classroom but beyond that. The department maintains a peaceful and productive environment for both the faculty and the students.

Out of the 20 students who appeared for ZOOA exam in the last session, 13 have achieved first class marks and the success rate is 100%. The highest mark obtained is 609. In the last three years, 7 ex-students

PG Attendance

A candidate shall be eligible for appearing at any of the Semesters of P.G. Examination, provided he/she prosecutes a regular course of studies in the concerned subject offered by the University keeping percentage of attendance as specified bellow:

- a) A student attending at least 75% of the total number of classes* held shall be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examination subject to fulfilment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.
- b) A student attending at least 60% but less than 75% of the total number of classes* held shall, however, be eligible to appear at the concerned Semester Examination upon obtaining condonation order from the Vice-Chancellor (Principal for affiliated colleges) and on payment of requisite condonation fees/ short attendance fees as may be prescribed by the University from time to time.
