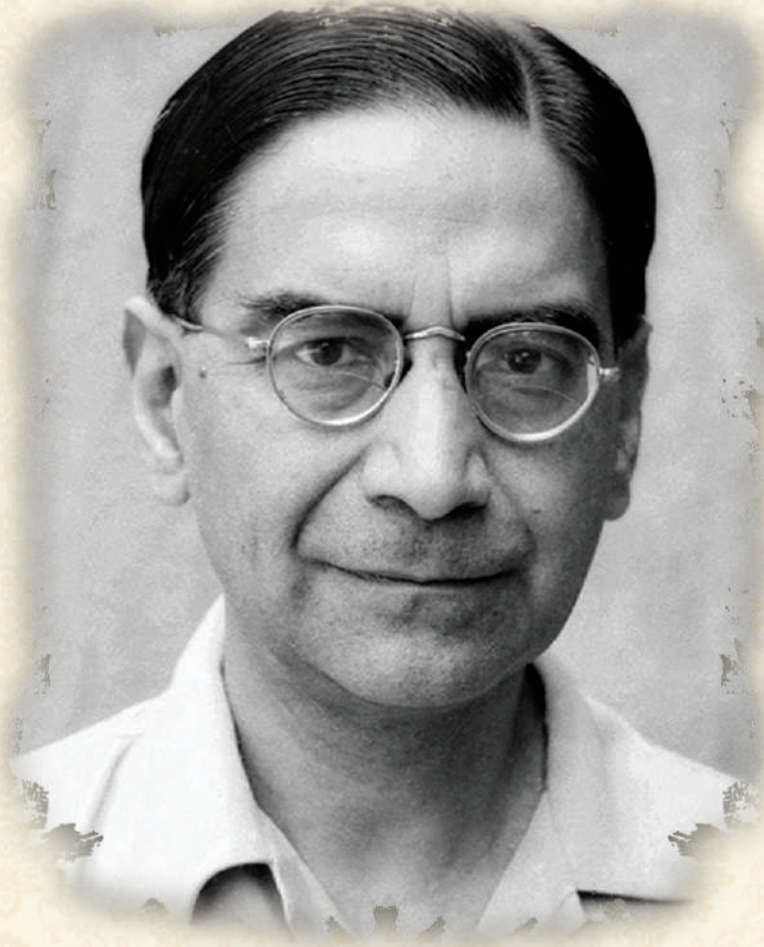

It gives me immense pleasure to introduce the academic prospectus of Prasanta Chandra Mahalanobis Mahavidyalaya for 2022-23, a historically significant academic venture, established in 1965, at Baranagar, in North Suburban Calcutta, in an area with a large number of poverty-stricken refugee population, but the area with a historicity, where the seeds of Bengal Renaissance grew into trees of Indian Renaissance. The basic need of opening an evening college in this area was to teach Commerce to the students residing in Cossipore, Baranagar & Kamarhati industrial hub who had to work during day time to earn their livelihood. There was no Evening (Commerce) college in the vast area from Shyambazar to Barrackpore. At the beginning, the college started functioning in the premises of Brahmananda Keshab Chandra College which was established in 1956 as a Govt. sponsored Day College for imparting higher education in Arts and Science subjects



Prasanta Chandra Mahalanobis Mahavidyalaya (earlier known as Bonhooghly College of Commerce) and Brahmananda Keshab Chandra College were established in an extended eco-friendly campus at 111/3 and, 111/2, B.T. Road, Kolkata- 700 108 respectively, near the Indian Statistical Institute, an internationally reputed institute of learning founded by Professor Prasanta Chandra Mahalanobis, FNA, FRS, the eminent statistician. The college is situated at 111/3, B.T. Road, Bonhooghly, Kolkata- 700 108, in an eco-friendly campus with a small, beautiful lake and encompassed by a wide variety of trees & plants offering a vibrant green and unpolluted environment.

On the western side, the busiest part of B.T Road, P. C. M. Mahavidyalaya shares bus stops with Indian Statistical Institute- an internationally acclaimed Institution, the founding father of which was Professor P.C. Mahalanobis after whom our college is named.

NAAC Accreditation: In the year 2008 The Peer Team of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council visited P. C. M. Mahavidyalaya, appreciated the academic and administrative arrangement, the library and laboratory facilities etc. They offered their valuable suggestions and accredited the college for the first time (1st cycle). In January 2019 the college was re-accredited for the 2nd cycle. Now P. C. M. Mahavidyalaya is one of the NAAC accredited degree colleges, affiliated to the West Bengal State University, Barasat, 24 Parganas (North) now preparing itself towards the re-accreditation by NAAC (3rd cycle..

I had to take over the charge of the college on 23rd December, 2021 due to untimely sad demise of our Principal Sir Dr. Shyamal Karmakar. I have been associated with this college since 1999 when it was named as Bonhooghly College of Commerce. Over the years with the endeavour of my seniors, peer and juniors the college has become a multidisciplinary educational institution. Affiliated to the University of Calcutta in 1965 as a commerce college we are now under the jurisdiction of the West Bengal State University. With 16 departments and dedicated faculties duly assisted by cooperative non-teaching staff we are catering the services to more than 1500 Students.



The college is located in an environment-friendly atmosphere far from the madding crowd. The college has spacious classrooms, a playground, library with over more than 30000 titles, well-equipped laboratories and gymnasium. The campus is totally wi-fi connected. Recently we have introduced add-on courses on YOGA (WBSU affiliated) and Value Education.

Our college has a collaboration with WEBEL (State Government Organization) to introduce diploma courses on Computer (including courses on computerized accounting and e commerce) at a very nominal rate of Rs 100- 150 per month. The college has been accredited by NAAC (1st cycle, 2009 and 2nd cycle, 2019)and we are constantly working towards its betterment.

There is a NSS unit duly constituted as per the relevant rules of the govt and the University with 120 student-volunteers ably supervised and mentored by a teacher-Programme Officer to carry out different social services.

Seminars, symposiums, career guidance programme for students, educational tours are conducted regularly to offer academic exposure to the students. Annual sports, Cultural competitions and yearly fest named 'Rhythm'provide the students with the opportunity to showcase their creative impulse to the greater audience.

We provide not only syllabus oriented learning but strive for the holistic development of our students.

With profound grief we pay homage to our Principal Dr. Shyamal Karmakar who all of a sudden left us for heavenly abode on 19th December, 2021. Dr. Karmakar joined our college as Principal on 3rd July, 2015. He started his career as a Lecturer in Physics in Kandi Raj College, Murshidabad on 7th February, 1989. After serving there for around 24 years he joined Lalbaba College Belur as a Principal on 26th September, 2012.

He was an erudite person and had several publications in national and international journals. During his tenure the college was accredited by NAAC in the second cycle. With his encouragement and effort the college opened the departments of Computer Science, Physics and Human Development. Smart classrooms were introduced in order to supplement and augment the traditional teaching-learning methodology. He initiated the process of installation of solar panel in order to save electrical energy and also to utilize the green energy. Under his dynamic leadership, the Ladies'(students') hostel was established and started functioning during his time. An annex building to accommodate more classes was built in this period.

Dr. Karmakar envisaged the inspiring scheme of Special Financial Assistance to the economically disadvantaged students of the college by constituting a Fund out of the contributions made by the teachers of the college. This initiative was taken to help the students to cope with the unprecedented economic crisis unleashed by the pandemic. With his amicable nature he administered the college keeping harmony among all the stakeholders—the students, the teachers and the members of the non-teaching staff.

We all express our compassion to the bereaved family members of Dr. Karmakar. It is our duty to carry out his unfinished work. Let his soul rest in peace.

Besides courses in Honours, UG degree is offered in Programme Courses in subjects like Chemistry and Physics along with the subjects mentioned above.

CBCS Structure in a Nutshell: As an affiliated college to WBSU, we have followed the CBCS pattern as per the curriculum prescribed by the University. The basic components of CBCS pattern is outlined below:

1. Core Course:

A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement of the chosen discipline(s) is termed as a Core course.

2. Elective Course:

Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

2.1 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course:

Elective courses may be offered by the main discipline /subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).

2.3 Generic Elective (GE) Course:

An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure is called a Generic Elective. P.S.: A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.

3. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):

The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses will be of two kinds:

Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC).

3.1 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):

Such courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement. These are mandatory for all disciplines e.g. i) Environmental Science, ii) English

Communication/MIL Communication (MIL stand for Modern Indian Language).

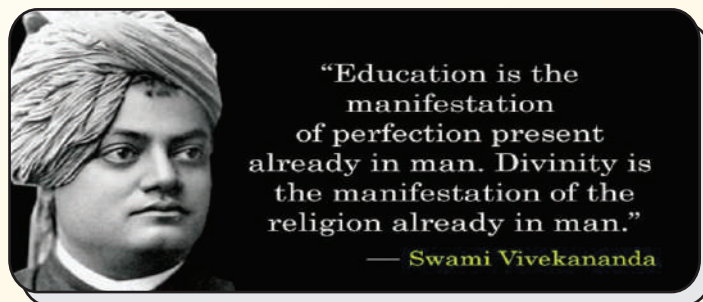
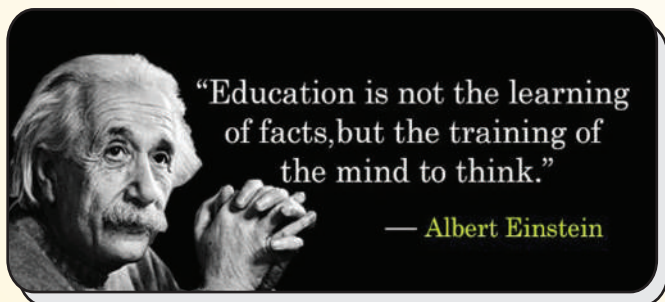
3.2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):

Such courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc. These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge.

ADMISSION RULES OF OUR COLLEGE (For the Session 2022-23)

Honours Courses:

- ◆ Applications are to be made on on-line basis following the minimum norms as set by the University. Merit list will be prepared on the basis of aggregate of best four subjects (excluding EVS) and the subject/related subject in which the student intends to study Honours. Course.
- ◆ Candidates passing H.S. or equivalent exams, from various Open Schools (except from National Institute of Open Schooling) are not eligible for admission.
- ◆ Candidates who had vocational course at the H.S. or equivalent exams, are eligible for admission only in Programme/General Course.
- ◆ Candidates who had not studied Geography (Economic Geography not considered) at 10+2 levels are not eligible to take up Honours in Geography.
- ◆ Candidates who had not studied Chemistry at 10+2 levels are not eligible to take up Honours in Food & Nutrition and to take up Chemistry as one of the General subjects in B.c. (General) course.

General Courses:

As per University norms on the basis of merit list prepared from on-line applicants.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Students are advised to apply through on line process at the college portal available at website named, www.pcomm.edu.in after the publication of the results of the W.B. Council/ISC/CBSE. or equivalent examination. Selected applicants are required to secure their admission on full payment of the requisite fees through this portal. Original Documents will be verified on the first day of the Academic Session as notified in the website. If the documents are found fake on verification, the admission will be cancelled.

Documents Required at the time of Verification:

Each admitted student must produce the following documents at the time of verification:

- ◆ The original mark-sheet of the last qualifying examination along with two attested photo copies of the same.
(Attestation is to be done only by the Headmaster/Headmistress of the school last attended.)
- ◆ The original Admit Card of Madhyamik/Equivalent examination along with two attested photo copies of the same.
(Attestation is to be done only by the Headmaster/Headmistress of the concerned school.)
- ◆ Two copies of recent passport-size coloured photograph.
- ◆ The scheduled caste / tribe / OBC certificate in original along with two attested photo copies of the same (only for SC/ST/OBC candidates). (Attestation is to be done by the Headmaster/Headmistress of the concerned school)
- ◆ The admission procedure is governed by the rules/regulations issued by the University and/or the State Govt. from time to time.
- ◆ All Admission are provisional under the rules and regulations of West Bengal State University (Barasat, North 24 Pgs.)

General Rules and Regulations

- ◆ Students must be present in the classes as per University Norms (minimum 75% attendance) and appear at the compulsory selection test. Otherwise they will not be allowed to be sent up for University Examinations. Furnishing a medical certificate as a reason of absence will not be considered for the same.
- ◆ Students must produce their identity cards issued by the college, whenever required, during college hours.
- ◆ Students must not deface the walls of the college building by writing slogans or pasting posters.
- ◆ Students must not gather together in front of class-rooms, teachers' room, library and office room. Loitering on the corridors is strictly prohibited.
- ◆ Visitors other than parents or guardians are not allowed to see students during college hours.
- ◆ Students are responsible for the safe custody of their books and belongings. The college will not be responsible for any loss thereof.
- ◆ Absence from college without leave is not allowed except in unforeseen circumstances, in which case immediate intimation should be given to the college authorities.
- ◆ The Name of a student absenting himself/herself from the college for a period of one month at a stretch without prior permission may be struck off the rolls.
- ◆ Any plea regarding irregular attendance leading to shortage of required percentage will not be entertained.
- ◆ Students against whom charges of repeated transgression of discipline are on record are liable to expulsion from college.
- ◆ Smoking is strictly prohibited within and in the vicinity of the college premise.
- ◆ Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited in the college campus. Serious measures will be taken against any person indulging in such activities.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Total area of the college is 1 acre out of which constructed area stands on 2,448 sq. mtrs. Ours is a three storied building with two wings arranged with furnished classrooms, Administrative buildings, laboratories, computer laboratory, smart class room, well-equipped library, office, multi-gym, Women's hostel, canteen, students' council room, separate common room for boys and girls. Our play ground is of medium size. In the eastern side of the building there is the cycle stand for the students and staff. There are two separate common rooms for the male and female students. Facilities of Table Tennis, Carom and Chess are there. Library is equipped with more than 17516 books, journals etc. The library reading room is adequately spacious. All the departments have separate departmental room. Our library, administrative office is fully computerized with efficient and devoted staff.

Women's Hostel: There is a Women's Hostel located within the premises of the college with well-furnished rooms and managed by a lady superintendent.

Laboratories: Departments like Chemistry, Geography, Food and Nutrition, Computer Science have well-equipped laboratories with modern facilities.

Smart Classroom: There is a dedicated Smart Classroom with adequate modern facilities in the college, and the traditional lecture method is well supplemented with ICT-enabled teaching methodologies.

Well-stocked Computerized Library: There are separate computers in the library for students for doing their projects. The library provides free access to a huge number of e-books and e-journals. Students can

borrow books from the central library as well as from departmental libraries.

Computer Training Centre in collaboration with WEBEL: The institution takes utmost care in offering job-oriented courses like certificate/diploma courses on computer for which a separate Computer Training Centre has been established in collaboration with WEBEL.

Solar Power Project: A rooftop solar PV system of capacity 20 kw has been installed on the main building of the college. The college is committed to the use of renewable energy and champions the cause of sustainable development in its approach to the environment.

Gymnasium: The institution believes in the holistic development of the learners for whom a Gymnasium with modern facilities has been constructed.

Common Room for Boys and Girls: There are separate Common Rooms for Boys and Girls with the facilities for indoor games.

Yoga Room: There is an exclusive room for Yoga. The institution takes utmost care in motivating students for practicing Yoga.

Canteen: The college has a canteen which provides students, teaching and non-teaching staff with hygienic and sumptuous food.

Cycle Stand: The college has a cycle stand under the supervision of a duly authorized person.

82.5 KV Electric Generator: The college has now achieved its capacity of supplying electricity to each and every part of its present and future building from its own high power generator of 82.5 KV. During the time of power-cut or supply failure.

Student Support Services

• Scholarships, Stipends, Free-Studentship:

The college disseminates the relevant information relating to various scholarships offered by the State Govt, UGC and other organizations/Trusts. In addition to the dissemination of information, the college extends support to students to avail of various scholarships and stipends. The college is committed to ensuring access to higher education to a large number of economically backward students by offering free-studentships. The severe economic crisis unleashed by the pandemic motivated the teachers of the college to raise fund on their own to offer financial assistance to the needy and regular students of the college

National Service Scheme (NSS) The students of the college are encouraged to enlist themselves as volunteers of the NSS to work towards the betterment of the adjacent locality by taking part in various outreach programmes organized by the NSS Unit monitored by a Programme Officer.

Remedial Classes The college is fully alert to the diverse categories of students and thus each Department conducts remedial classes for both the Honours and Programme Course students in order to facilitate the students to overcome any difficulty they may face during their regular classes,

Counselling Sessions The College appreciates the need for both psycho-social counseling and career guidance for the young learners who may experience varied issues of psychological dilemma and may lack in necessary confidence in facing the challenges of life. Regular counselling sessions under the supervision of experts are organized to offer general guidance to students to require empathetic and non-judgmental counselling. Special care is taken to ensure strict confidentiality. Various counselling sessions with

regard to various jobs are also organized to offer support to students to make them employable.

The students may submit their grievances relating to various aspects of the college administration and support services in writing, and the college strives hard to redress the grievances ventilated by the learners.

Educational Tours The Educational Tour is organized as per the CBCS syllabus of the concerned department like Geography. However, we encourage each department to undertake Educational / Study Tour so as to offer greater exposure to students in various academic and life-enriching experiences.

Access to Internet and Wi-Fi Facilities: Students can access to free internet and Wi-Fi facilities for academic purposes.

Access to Pure Drinking Water : Water cooler and pure drinking water machines have been installed in each floor of the building of the college.

Right to Information (R.T.I): As per the directives of the Supreme Court and the State Govt, the college has appointed two teachers to act as State Public Information Officer and Appellate Authority to respond to any queries or information sought by any stakeholders as per the R.T.I. Act.

Academic Calendar: The College adheres to the academic calendar that specifically stipulates the

schedules of various academic activities conducted in an academic session. The students are advised to familiarize themselves with the schedule to make better utilization of the resources and various academic events organized in the college.

Students' Fest: The Students' Council of the College organizes Annual Cultural Programme rhythm every year and the learners showcase their cultural bent of mind during the event. Moreover, the doyen of the entertainment industry is invited to enthral the students with his/her performance.

Mentor-Mentee Session: We strive to take care of each and every student in their academic and other related needs by organizing Mentor-Mentee session in which a teacher-mentor personally offers guidance to the student-mentee. The students are encouraged to meet the teachers for any guidance and assistance.

Anti-Ragging Cell: The college adopts the policy of zero tolerance to the complaints of any forms of ragging and the Anti-Ragging Cell takes up any complaints for possible action immediately. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited and any complaints will be severely dealt with.

College Magazine: The college Magazine is published annually. The budding writers among students try their hand at various genres of literature through this magazine.

Seminars and Symposia: Seminars and symposia on both academic and national issues, in presence of distinguished invitees, are regularly held in the

college for widening the mental horizon of students.

Library:

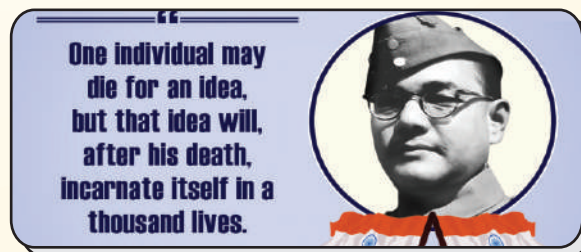
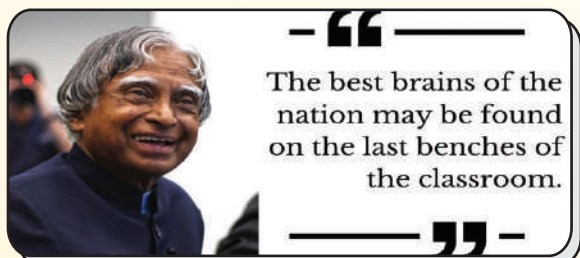
