FROM THE DESK OF Hon'ble Vice Chancellor

The University has 23 academic departments and offers 49 academic programmes with present intake capacity of 980 students in postgraduate level and 1426 students in undergraduate level.

In 2019, Aliah University was included in the list of Universities under section 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956. It has introduced Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) to the undergraduate programs and planning to introduce it in the PG Courses in the session 2021-22.

The University has set up an Institute's Innovation Council (IIC) as well as Innovation Centre with the principal objective to boost local home-bred entrepreneurial and start-up ventures which may help students, faculties and other members of the ambient population. We are trying to get projects funded by Central as well as State Government that may help to strengthen its drive in the domain of social entrepreneurship. Aliah University is also a member of Confederation of Indian Industry (CII). The University has established strong academic linkages with various national and international institutions. Academicians from a large number of universities visit and participate in various academic programmes at Aliah University.

This year we are planning to introduce Bachelors in Medical Laboratory Technology (BMLT) and Value Added Courses (VACs) to enhance the employability of our students.

The education sector along with the socio-economic fabric of the country had not been as rattled as it is now since March 2020. Keeping the wellness of the stakeholders as a priority, the institutes of learning – schools, colleges and universities – have closed shops since then and not sure when it will resume its normal functions. Nevertheless, that does not mean that the teaching learning has stopped. We have shifted from a physical platform to a digital one. Thus, education today has undergone a massive change because of the digital mode. We, at Aliah University, implemented G-Suite to use the Google Classroom Platform for imparting regular classes. Before starting the classes, we conducted a structured teachers' training to get them used to the new systems. There were initial hiccups but now both the students and teachers have adapted themselves to this change. However, the warmth of teacher-student relationship is amiss and connectivity issues are rampant.

The University actively participated in the relief activities to the peoples affected by the fury of Amphan in 2020 and Yaas in 2021.

In the pandemic situation, different departments of the Aliah University organized a large number of webinars with distinguished experts, professionals and in-house faculty members as panellists on the thrust areas. These webinars were targeted on faculty development programmes (FDPs), innovation & research.

Training and Placement Cell has introduced the “Communicative English and Student Development Programme” for B. Tech., MBA, MCA students. A programme on “Elementary English for Adult Learners” also introduced for Theology and Arabic students. As a step towards academic and industrial partnership, Aliah University has signed MOUs with many renowned organizations e.g. National Small Industries Corporation Ltd. (NSIC), KRACKiN Skill X etc. To enhance employability, core competencies among students, experts from industry and professional organizations are invited for grooming, up-skilling, and soft skill-development of students from 3rd year and final year batches. Total number of On-Campus, Pool Campus, and Off-Campus drives held between 2018 -2020 (March) is 114.

A unique of its kind, the University presently has 3 Campuses, 23 Departments, and offers 49 different academic as well as professional programmes. Research programmes in various disciplines are also being pursued actively and there is immense scope for progress in the near future.

We, at the Aliah University, endeavour to inculcate competency, creativity, and compassion in every student to work for the advancement of the educationally backward classes and marginalized sections of the society. The University believes in cultural pluralism and unity in diversity for which our country is always recognized everywhere with deep respect.

Due to prevailing pandemic situation, this year also Aliah University Admission is going to start in two phases. In Phase-I, admission of all UG and MBA programmes will be taken through merit score calculation based on qualifying examination/examinations except B.Tech, BCA, Lateral entry to 2nd year B.Tech and Nursing programmes for which Aliah University Admission Test (AUAT)-2021 will be taken and admission will be followed based on merit in the test. In Phase-II, admission of all PG and B.Ed programmes will be taken through merit score calculation based on qualifying examination/examinations. For this, a separate notification will be made in due course of time.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

Aliah University has a unique pre-history. A brief look at this will offer an understanding of its social and cultural importance.

Aliah University has a unique pre-history. A brief look at this will offer an understanding of its social and cultural importance. Its parent institution Aliah Madrasah was the first government-funded educational institution in British India. The chief intention for establishing this institution was to educate the children of Muslim families in Arabic, Persian and Muslim Law so that they might be eligible to get jobs in different Government Departments like revenue administration and the judiciary. However, within a decade the curriculum of Aliah Madrasah had also encompassed modern subjects like arithmetic, geometry, astronomy and the natural sciences along with the more traditional branches of learning like Law, Theology, Elementary Grammar, Philosophy and Logic. In 1821, the Annual Examination of the Madrasah was held in the presence of many respectable officials and gentlemen of Calcutta. This was the first public examination held in British India. A medical class, headed by Dr Peter Breton, Professor of Medicine, was started at this Madrasah in 1826 for the first time in British India. Dr Breton was authorized to purchase a skeleton and collect medical books. An anatomical work published by John Taylor was arranged to be translated into Arabic. The medical class continued here till the establishment of Calcutta Medical College in 1836. However, the students of the Madrasah were allowed to study medicine at Calcutta Medical College. This speaks for the high standard of education at the Madrasah in those days. English was first introduced at Aliah Madrasah in 1826, though the number of students was quite low as Persian was still medium of administration in British India. In 1854 at the recommendation of a Committee an English school, in the name of Anglo-Persian Department, was started under the direct control of the Principal of Calcutta Madrasah.

After the Revolt of 1857, the British rulers began to have a suspicious attitude to the Muslims. There were proposals to abolish the Madrasah. However, in 1860, the Government of India, rejecting the idea of abolition, rather recommended improvement in its management. So the Madrasah continued to exist. Some reforms were introduced at the Calcutta Madrasah according to the suggestions of a committee consisting of C.H. Campbell, Commissioner of the Presidency Division, I. Sutcliff, Principal of Presidency College, and Nawab Abdul Latif, then a Deputy Magistrate. Further reforms were introduced at the recommendations of the Education Commission headed by W.W. Hunter in 1884. Nawab Abdul Latif and Justice Syed Amir Ali played a very important role in these reforms.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

In 1896 Elliot Hostel was founded, with funds raised out of donations from the public. In 1902 the Muslim Institute was established as a part and parcel of Calcutta Madrasah. The Principal of the Madrasah was ex-officio President and Treasurer of the Muslim Institute. Several committees and commissions were appointed in 1915, 1923, 1931, 1938-40, and 1946 for the improvement in the syllabi, curricula and all round development of Madrasah education in Bengal, particularly of Calcutta Madrasah. After Partition in 1947, this institution again faced severe problems. According to the decision of the Separation Council, all books and manuscripts, assets and estates of the Aliah Madrasah were transferred to the Dacca Madrasah. It was only at the initiative of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, the first Education Minister of independent India, that the institutional framework of Calcutta Madrasah was again set up and teaching restarted. In 2001, the Government of West Bengal, under the direction of the eminent educationist and the then Governor of West Bengal and Bihar, Dr. A. R. Kidwai, formed a Madrasah Education Committee. This Committee presented its recommendations for the continued development and future excellence of Aliah Madrasah in 2002. Finally, the over-two-hundred-year old institution was elevated to the status of a University in 2007. Aliah University – a State University under the Department of Minority Affairs and Madrasah Education, Government of West Bengal – came into existence through the Aliah University Act (Act XXVII of 2007) passed by the West Bengal Legislative Assembly. The Act came into force on 5 April 2008. Classes were being held in various rented buildings at Sector I and Sector V of Salt Lake City, apart from the Heritage building at Haji Md Mohsin Square. In 2011 the Government of West Bengal led by Mamata Banerjee, the Hon'ble Chief Minister, allotted 20 acres of land at New Town and the foundation stone for the New Town Campus was laid by her on 15 December 2011. The newly-built building was inaugurated by her on 11 November 2014, National Education Day. By this time the G+ 9 building at Park Circus Campus was also completed. So, the academic and administrative activities of the university started at both these two new campuses from January 2015. It may be observed that Aliah Madrasah from its early days imparted teaching in both the traditional subject of theology and the modern sciences, social sciences, and humanities. To keep alive this tradition of teaching, right from the start, Aliah University has offered courses in the traditional Islamic Theology and Arabic along with subjects like English, Bengali, History and Geography and many other branches of Science (Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Statistics, Biological Sciences) as well as Engineering (Civil, Mechanical, Electrical, Electronics and Communications, Computer Science and Engineering), Management and Business Administration, Nursing and Journalism and Mass Communication. Keeping in mind the requirements of the employment sector in the 21st century, right from the start, great emphasis has been put on courses in the Sciences, Engineering, Technology and Management so that students from the minority community become eligible and can compete for jobs in various sectors. In keeping with the great stress laid by the UGC on the Semester system of education and Letter Grade process of marking, Aliah University has adopted semesterization, credit system, continuous assessment, and letter grading from its inception. All UG curriculum is running under CBCS pattern as per UGC from 2019-20 and 2020-21 academic sessions and steps are already being taken to introduce the CBCS in all PG programmes from 2021-22 academic session.

- For fresher candidates, in the case of Honours Graduate, the marks obtained in Honours Subject will be considered.
- In the case of General Graduates, the total marks obtained in General/Subsidiary/Pass subjects will be considered.
- If any category seat remains vacant it will be filled up by another category of the same method subject or may be transferred to other method subject as may be deemed fit by competent authority.

Those who are appearing the qualifying examinations in the session 2020-2021 may also apply for admission. However, they are to submit the mark sheet before preparation of the merit list.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

AGE LIMIT AS ON 31ST DECEMBER 2021 (ALL PG & B.ED PROGRAMMES):

The upper age limit is 25 years as on 31st December 2021 except for the following: (i) M.A. in Islamic Theology, Islamic Studies, M.Tech.-27 years, (ii) B.Ed.-30 years, (iii) M.A. in Education-32 years, (iv) No upper age limit for LL.M.

Though the upper age limit is mentioned above, all the applicants applying for postgraduate programs who have passed the qualifying examination before 2019 are not eligible to apply.

SELECTION AND ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- All Candidates wish to take admission in Aliah University must apply through online mode of application only, link for which will be given in the university website on scheduled date.
- Candidates have to upload the required documents during application.
- After submitting the online application successfully a confirmation sheet/application pdf bearing the full application summary with the photo & signature of the candidate will be generated by the system. Application is not complete until the confirmation sheet/application submission form is generated.
- Candidates have to download and print the confirmation sheet/application submission form and should preserve the same carefully.
- A general merit list will be published for Islamic Theology and the next e-counseling will be done to select the centre. Taking part in e-counselling process does not guarantee the admission. If candidate were not allotted in his/her 1st choice, we will consider his/her 2nd choice (if given by his/her) and this process will continue until his/her last choice. Any decision will be taken by the conducting authority in regard to any issue related to counselling will be deemed as final.
- All the available seats will be considered for allotment.
- The allotment result will be declared on the university website at <https://aliah.ac.in>
- After getting an allotment, candidates have to pay the admission fees through online mode. Details will be made available on website
- In case candidates fail to present/ attend at the online admission processes then, the seat will be offered to the next candidate in line.
- All admission will be provisional and will stand cancelled if the candidate fails to satisfy the eligibility criteria at any stage.

SELECTION AND ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- After taking online admission candidates have to physically come to the University campuses by strictly following the covid-19 protocol for final admission/documents verification process. In this regards relevant information will be available on website

Documents required for Final Admission / Documents Verification

The following documents in original & two sets of self attested photocopies are required at the time of final admission/documents verification.

- 1) Confirmation Sheet/submitted application form.
- 2) Rank Card.
- 3) Online admission receipt/ payment receipt.
- 4) Filled in Admission Form with passport size photo attached.
- 5) Anti-ragging undertaking of parent and candidate both in non-judicial Rs. 10 stamp paper (given at ANNEXURE A and ANNEXURE B duly affirmed in front of an Oath Commissioner).
- 6) All original Mark sheets & Certificates of class X, XII and Graduation (wherever applicable).
- 7) Admit card of 10th level.
- 8) Proof of age: 10th standard admit card/10th standard certificate/birth certificate.
- 9) PC/PwD certificate in original (wherever applicable).
- 10) Migration certificate (if previously studied in any another university).
- 11) Transfer certificate or college leaving certificate issued by the college. No other certificate in lieu of this will be accepted.
- 12) Character certificate to be obtained on the college letter head/pad, no other certificate in lieu of this will be accepted.
- 13) Residential proof (Voter Card/Aadhar Card)/Residential certificate from competent authority.
- 14) Two copies of recent passport size photograph.

IMPORTANT NOTES

- All the Post Graduate programs including LL.M programs are day programs.
- For all the Post Graduate programs except 2 year M.A. in Education, 80% of seats will be reserved for internal candidates (Students who have completed their last degree from Aliah University) and 20% of seats will be reserved for external candidates.
- In a 2-year M.A. in Journalism and Mass Communication, the division of seats is 50% for BA JMC/Media Science/Film Studies, 25% for Science/Engineering, and 25% for Humanities/Social Sciences.
- The seats reserved for internal candidates may be filled from the list of external candidates if the list of internal candidates exhaust and vice-versa.
- In 2 year LL.M. program the division of seats as per specialization shall be: 15 in Business Law and 15 in Family Law, specialization will be on the basis of merit of 1st semester total marks.
- As M.Tech courses run by Aliah University are not approved by the AICTE, no MHRD/GATE scholarship is available to the admitted students.
- All admission will be provisional. Admission through AUAT-2021 will stand canceled if the candidate fails to satisfy the eligibility criteria at any stage.
- All admissions are subject to verification of particulars from the original mark Sheet/Grade Card and other documents of the candidate.

RESERVATION OF SEATS

- RESERVATION OF SEATS: The category of a candidate other than PC/PwD is hereby termed as GEN category.
- PHYSICALLY CHALLENGED (PC) CANDIDATES /PERSON WITH DISABILITY (PWD) - 4 % seats are reserved for candidates belonging to the PC/PwD category, who are otherwise fit to pursue any programme. For any category of disability (viz., orthopedic, visual, speech, and/or hearing), benefit would be given to those candidates who have at least 40% permanent physical impairment in relation to a body part/system/extremity/extremities/ whole body, etc.
- The candidates in this category will be required to submit a certificate of impairment from the competent authority.
- NB: After the last counselling if any reserved seat/seats remain vacant, the University will fill up the vacant seat/seats from GEN category strictly from the merit list or vice versa.
